#### How was 2024...

Once again, we see how the living conditions of homeless people continue to worsen, mainly due to the negative impact of several structural factors. Among these, an increasingly unequal labour market that perpetuates precariousness, a very residual supply of social housing and a disproportionate increase in rental prices stand out. Added to this is an excessively bureaucratized and insufficient benefits and subsidies policy, immigration legislation that makes it difficult for people in an irregular administrative situation to access basic rights, and the weakening of social protection networks, which increases pressure on services such as those offered by SJD Serveis Socials.

During 2024, we have strengthened specialized care for specific populations, with continued attention to young people and the launch of the AVIDI house in Calella, in collaboration with the Daughters of Sant Josep, in-

tended for older women. We have also expanded and diversified our services to comprehensively address the growing complexity of situations, marked by the intersection of educational, labour, psychological and legal factors. This response has been carried out in collaboration with other entities.

Despite structural obstacles that often act as invisible walls, qualitative data shows a positive impact on people's lives, in line with the results of previous years. This consolidates our care model, which will be reviewed and updated in 2025.

The entity has continued to focus on active external communication, the creation of alliances and participation in networks, with the aim of maximizing the social impact of our work.

Looking ahead to 2025, we will continue to improve our care model, facing challenges such as digital transformation, innovation and knowledge generation, in order to improve the support and care of people in situations of great vulnerability, with the aim of contributing to a dignified and meaningful life.

## Mission, vision and values

Our **Mission** is to create opportunities for a dignified and meaningful life for people who do not have a home, offering holistic support. In accordance with the values and charisma of the Hospitaller Order of Saint John of God and the social commitment of the church, we promote coexistence and full citizenship for all, based on the recognition of human rights. The support provided to people is based on a more just and equitable model of society, based on the value of hospitality and solidarity.

#### **Vision**

Become a reference organisation in social action in Catalonia and in the Order as a whole, that:

- > Implements a comprehensive care model with transformational projects that put people at the centre.
- > Builds a strong, sustainable organisation to guarantee continuity of the present programmes and start new projects in the future.
- > Adopts a clear institutional discourse that is tangible to government authorities, the people who receive support, partners, donors and society as a whole.
- > Nourishes the Hospitaller Order's charisma and allows itself to be permeated by it.
- > Weaves alliances and solidarity networks with other centres affiliated with the Order, particularly in Catalonia, and with other organisations with similar aims, within the framework of social action at provincial level.

#### **Values**

Our values are rooted in Hospitality as our fundamental principle, essential value and main virtue, supported by the other values: Spirituality, Quality, Respect and Responsibility.

#### Concerning the services

We organize events that strengthen alliances and increase knowledge:

- We are opening the AVIDI House in Calella, together with the Daughters of Sant Josep, to accompany 15 elderly women in a homeless situation.
- 2. We celebrate the day "Cultures that add up: Job Placement and Diversity" to connect, inspire and denounce.
- We commemorate the 5th anniversary of the Bishop Carrera Inclusion Program in Badalona, together with the Llegat Roca i Pi Foundation and Cáritas Diocesana Barcelona.

### **Professionals and volunteers**

The organization's professional and volunteer team is constantly evolving to accompany the people we serve with the best quality and hospitality and ensure that their recovery processes are optimal.

In 2024 we had one person from the **ESAL line**, a call promoted by the SOC and the Department of Business and Employment of the Generalitat de Catalunya, aimed at hiring unemployed women, trans people and people in long-term unemployment.

We also have two professionals from the **ACOL line**, the Treball i Formació (Work and Training) programme run by the Government of Catalonia and the Catalan Employment Service (SOC), aimed at immigrants in irregular administrative situations to contribute to their socio-labour insertion.

#### **Training**

Continuous training is a fundamental tool for having a highly competent team, for this reason, we have a specific training plan for the professional team and another for the volunteer team:

#### Professionals:

- > 47 training activities | 627 hours of training | 100% of people trained.
- > New recruits are included in a specific training plan with a total of 36 hours.
- > Subject areas: Knowledge and technique | Skills and attitudes | Regulations | Tools | Languages | Care for people (health and safety) | Identity.

#### Volunteers:

- > 8 training activities | 114 hours of training | 35% of the people have participated in the proposed trainings.
- Subject areas: Knowledge and technique | Skills and attitudes | Tools for caring for people | Identity | Tools | Regulations.

#### Work environment

In 2024, actions from the Opina 2023-2024 Action Plan continued to be applied to improve team cohesion, internal organization, recognition of professionals, the sense of belonging and care for emotional health, as a result of the work climate survey carried out in 2022. A new edition of the survey is planned for 2025.

#### **Equality plan**

In 2024, the 2023-2027 Equality Plan continues to be socialized and implemented among the team of professionals.

# Our programmes

Our portfolio of services responds to people experiencing homelessness, focusing on the specific needs of the most vulnerable population: young people, women, families, the elderly and mental health. In addition, a link is established between the different services to accompany each person according to their life stage.

To achieve this, we have the following services:

- > 4 Residential Inclusion Centres
- > 4 Shared housing projects
- > 3 Individual housing projects
- > 1 Specific care program for women
- > 1 Day Centre
- > 1 Prevention service
- > 1 Free Dental Consult

And in all cases, we work to guarantee access and maintenance of the home.

# For single adults: residential inclusion centres

We have facilities where the people we serve have their basic needs covered and from where they can work on social and labour inclusion; and other aspects such as physical and mental health or the recovery of family ties.

A team of integration, education and social work professionals works in the centres and accompanies each person according to their needs so that they can achieve their life goals.







#### Futur&Co

The project was born with the aim of enabling young people at risk of social and residential exclusion to become autonomous and live a full life. With the results of Futur&Co, we want to participate in the development of new emancipatory state and regional public policies to address youth homelessness.

In 2024, the evaluation and closure phases of the project will be carried out once the care support phase has been completed, during 2022 and 2023. In 2025, we continue to support young people in the project who need a final boost towards full autonomy.

The cooperation between entities facilitates the creation of a shared, consensual, evaluated methodology.

Futur&Co is one of the projects selected by the Ministry of Social Rights and 2030 Agenda to receive EU Next Generation funds for social innovation.



### Social innovation

The European Social Fund grants us the COMHOM (Combating Homelessness) project, which aims to transform the response to homelessness in Europe through data collection and processing, the use of digital tools and a standardized monitoring and evaluation (M&E) framework. COMHOM is a three-year initiative set to launch in the first semester of 2025.

The COMHOM consortium brings together a diverse group of partners with extensive experience in social services, research and digital transformation. Leaded by Saint John of God Social Services Barcelona and the affiliated entity Saint John of God Research Foundation, the consortium is formed by Saint John of God Valencia (Spain), Value for Health CoLAB (Portugal), Metropolia University of Applied Sciences (Finland), Social IT (Italy), Chino.io (Italy), Simon Communities of Ireland (Ireland), PRACTICE (Greece), and the European Social Network (Belgium). The associated entities, FEANTSA, Y-Foundation, and SMEs Europe, also play a key role in ensuring the impact and scope of the project.

The COMHOM project has received funding from the European Social Fund (ESF) of the European Union under grant agreement no. 101172624.

#### Law on the rights of the homeless

During 2024, the procedures continue in the Parliament of Catalonia for the approval of The draft law on transitional and urgent measures to tackle and eradicate homelessness. In March, the Parliament was dissolved

and with it the parliamentary procedure lapsed. However, once the new Parliament was formed, the steps to re-submit the law began and are progressing satisfactorily. At the time of publication of this report, the Proposal has been accepted again for consideration by the Plenary of Parliament.

The Bill's sponsoring institutions, jointly with Sant Joan de Déu Serveis Socials: Assís Centre d'Acollida, Arrels Fundació, Càritas Catalunya and the Comunitat de Sant' Egidi, and a group of legal experts led by Dr Antoni Milian, professor of administrative law at the Autonomous University of Barcelona. Antoni Milian.

#### Housing for young people

The new homes for young people are an initiative that seeks to transform and modernize the care system for people in vulnerable situations.

It consists of a partial architectural renovation of the facility Hort de la Vila as a response to a new healthcare model.

The project starts in 2022 thanks to the granting of European Next Generation funds and the support of SJD Spain for its co-financing. During 2024 and the first quarter of 2025, work was carried out to transform individual rooms into 27 apartments.

The new housing project is aimed at young people in vulnerable situations and has a preventive objective, to avoid situations of homelessness. The new model aspires to have a systemic impact in Barcelona and Catalonia, and could become a benchmark in informing public strategies and policies on youth homelessness in Spain.

As a result of this reform, the Hort de la Vila facility will have two distinct devices: a residential inclusion centre

for homeless adults in agreement with the Barcelona City Council; and a block of 27 apartments for young people in vulnerable situations.

IKEA is a partner in the project, providing furniture for the apartments and common areas, as well as contributing to a Dual FPO project offering training (through the Fundació Germà Benito Menni and Formació i Treball Foundation) and employment to young participants in the program. IKEA's contribution is part of its Llars Impuls initiative.

We appreciate the support of all these organizations that have collaborated with the housing project for young people, initially called Hort de la Vila 2.0.

#### **Free Dental Care**

A dentistry service to guarantee free, quality, specialised dental care to the adult and paediatric population in a situation of poverty, social exclusion or at risk of social exclusion, with a basic portfolio of services that complements the public portfolio. The goal of the service is to offer the benefits for personal health derived from adequate oral and dental hygiene and functionality, and to offer the social and psycho-emotional benefits associated with suitable oral and dental hygiene and appearance.

During 2024, 437 requests were received from adults | 125 from children.

995 hours of adult care have been provided | 775 hours of hygienist care | 205 hours of paediatric care.

1,136 treatments have been performed on men and women | 284 treatments on children.

Also 288 removable dentures have been placed and 131 follow-up appointments have been made for people whose dentures have been fitted.

Project co-managed with the Sant Joan de Déu Hospital and coordinated with Barcelona City Council.

#### Som Salut Mental 360

We are members of this digital platform's management and technical committees. Its goal is to provide accurate, reliable information to empower, support, inform, foster awareness and promote mental health. # **Solidarity**

Socially committed companies are an engine of change that drives a more equitable society. We thank all those companies and entities that, with their support, allow us to offer better care and contribute to guaranteeing a dignified life for everyone.

- > IKEA has committed, through its Llars Impuls initiative, to the project of comprehensive care for vulnerable young people, through housing support, training and the creation of job opportunities so that they have a dignified future.
- > For the eighth consecutive year, **Moventia and TRAM**, have provided transport for the people supported, enabling them to access new opportunities (training, employment...). With their support, more than 4,200 people have benefited from the partnership, 692 of them in 2024.
- The Santander Bank has committed to the Futur&-Co project, so that young people in a homeless situation can achieve an autonomous life.
- With the Social Work of Sant Joan de Déu we have of a collaboration agreement with which we finance social projects. The Social Work has campaigns such as "Unwanted Loneliness", in which we have actively participated, which allow us to raise awareness among citizens and provide funding.
- > 4 entities and organisations have taken part through corporate volunteering actions. Their time has been very valuable: Barber Angels, Aflorfarm, Zurich and Forcadell.
- > Thanks to SJD's Social Work, they have also supported us with financial contributions: Yurbban Hotels, Leroy Merlin, Zurich and Cevasa and with donations in kind 53 more companies. In addition, the Ruta de la Luz Foundation it has adjusted the eyesight of a hundred people and provided new glasses to those treated who required them.

- The Associació Cívica La Nau maintains its undertaking to provide donations in kind which help us improve essential services.
- > **Private donors** who contributed €10,000 to the entity's projects.

Committed companies and private donors have offered more than €420,000 to improve the quality of life of people served by the organization's different programs. *Thank you!* 

We also work with citizens doing **awareness-raising actions**:

- > With the project #educaSJD we raise awareness about homelessness in 12 educational centres and carry out 4 APS (learning and service projects). More than 300 students and 19 teachers participate.
- Magic Line: we are part of the solidarity citizen mobilization organized by Solidaritat SJD. We raise awareness and obtain funding for our social projects.
- > We remain close to our community celebrating the major festivals in the towns of Poble-sec, Sarrià and Sant Genís districts in Barcelona with different activities and in commemorating World Homeless Day in Barcelona and Badalona and the International Volunteer's Day. And we continue to carry out community activities that allow us to dialogue with our neighbourhood, such as "Community 360", which we carry out with the National Art Museum of Catalonia (MNAC) or the "Community Pot" workshops with the El Sortidor Civic Center.

# We offer a full range of support services

- Legal service, with the Fundació FICAT. We offer specialised legal support to people who need to obtain legal residence in Spain. In total, 105 people received advice.
- > **Psychological care**. In 2024 we will incorporate the figure of a clinical psychologist to provide care to people accompanied to the projects in Badalona, who have a high need for mental health care. Psychological support has also been provided by the Mental Health Team for Homeless People (ESMES).
- Personal support to people who sleep on the street in Badalona, with the Folre Day Centre. We have attended 246 people in 2024. It has increased by 32% compared to the previous year. Folre coordinates with a network of inclusion dwellings to care for homeless people in Badalona and facilitate their full recovery.

We manage this programme within the Bisbe Carrera Inclusion Programme, supported by the Fundació Llegat Roca i Pi, Càritas Diocesana de Barcelona and the Hospitaller Order of Saint John of God.

- > **Spiritual attention**. In 2024 we will promote the Spiritual and Religious Care Service (SAER) by offering new services, which are added to direct care.
  - > We provide 118 services and 15 individual accompaniments.
  - > We accompany family members, colleagues, professionals and volunteers in the event of the death of people we care for: we have held 8 farewells.
  - > In cases of charity burials, we place commemorative plaques, in a gesture to dignify the memory.
  - > We develop an end-of-life care protocol.
  - > We designed an interior space at the CRI La Llavor and two spaces of remembrance for the deceased, one at the CRI Hort de la Vila and the other at the CRI La Llavor.

- > The Conecta-TE group is launched to work on topics of interest to the people served. People linked to different Christian traditions participate: Orthodox, Evangelical, Protestant, Catholic and also Muslim; thus an ecumenical and inter-religious group is created that enriches all participants.
- > We improve **job opportunities** through the insertion service of the same entity and with the support of around fifty specialized organizations or those that have specific programs: ACCEM, ACIDH, Assis, ALONSO&CO, Barcelona Activa, Bayt al Thagafa, Biciclot, El Sortidor Civic Center, Poble-sec Community Development Plan Social and Labour Commission, Red Cross, El Llindar, New Opportunities School, Engrunes, Espigoladors, Work with Heart of Caritas, Francesc Palau, FICAT, Active Community of ABD Foundation, Adecco Foundation, ARED Foundation, Àurea Foundation, Sant Joan de Déu Dependency Care Foundation (FAD), Catalonia Foundation, Femarec Foundation, Training and Work Foundation (D'Ins), Getup Foundation, JOIA Foundation, Germà Benito Menni Foundation, Mambré Foundation, Health and Community Foundation, Fundesplai, Gramelmpuls, Sant Joan de Déu Hospital, Impulsem, Intecserveis CET, Intermèdia, Mescladís, Més que cures, Migraestudium, Refugees Welcome, La Troca, SJD Social Work, Gràcia Mental Health, SOC, Solidança, SUARA, SURT, Sants-Montjuïc Tourism Sector Table, Trànsit Projecte, T'acompanyem, Old Town Labour Network, XFOL Horta-Guinardó Economic Promotion and YMCA.

43% of the people who receive support find work while attending the entity's different programmes. 28% of people are following an active work/training path.

- We support Meals in Company, a project to tackle loneliness and promote the healthy lives of elderly people in vulnerable situations.

The service is organised within Barcelona City Council's Social Rights, Global Justice, Feminisms and LGTBI Area.

# Impact in the communication media

Throughout the year, we have continued to promote homelessness on the media agenda. We are convinced that the media play a key role in raising social awareness, in the fight against prejudice and stereotypes, and in promoting a more empathetic, inclusive and committed narrative towards homeless people.

We have had more than 80 impacts in various areas. The issues that have stood out have been female homelessness, with the launch of Casa AVIDI and the 5th anniversary of the Insula program; the Law to address Homelessness, which we co-promoted; and the projects to care for homeless people in Badalona, as we celebrated the 5th anniversary of the Bisbe Carrera Inclusion Program.

# We manage knowledge

Via several networks of entities where we share knowledge and develop new projects:

ble-sec Community Plan, the SJD Mental Health Network, the Table of Third Sector Entities, the Badalona Homeless Table, XAPSLL (homeless care network in Barcelona), the Network of Inclusion Dwellings and the Metropolitan Residential Inclusion Network.

We also work with:

- > Parc Sanitari Sant Joan de Déu for the construction of a social and health care proposal.
- Strategic Mental Health Plan of Sant Joan de Déu in Catalonia.

# We share knowledge

During the year we have participated in 17 events and conferences and have provided 7 training courses to entities and educational centres; we have also published 6 articles for specialized magazines and social media.

## Transparency management

In 2024 a budget of **8.2 million euros** was managed to care for homeless people.

We manage investment projects with great economic impact:

- The housing project for young people involves an investment of 3.6 million euros, 2.5 of which will be invested in 2024.
- The European project COMHOM obtains funding of 5 million euros for the 2025–2027 period.

Through responsible and efficient economic management, we promote opportunities that favour the personal and social development of people. The objective is that they can recover a dignified life and advance in the construction of their life projects with autonomy and dignity.

#### Quality and responsibility mark our work system.

At Sant Joan de Déu Serveis Socials we audit our annual accounts with the external auditor Auren.


We audit our processes. During 2024:
